Structure, governance and management

Type of governing document

The Dava Way Association, a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO) incorporated on 09 Apr 2014 and governed by a Constitution

Trustee recruitment and appointment

All Trustees stand down at the Annual Members Meeting (AMM) but can stand for reselection.

Appointment to trusteeship is open to members of the DWA who wish to become a trustee. (subject to scrutiny)

Trustees are appointed at the AMM by those members present at the meeting or subsequently by the board of trustees in accordance with the Constitution.

Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes

The purposes of the DWA are:

- to engage a volunteer workforce of sufficient capacity to improve, repair and maintain the path called the Dava Way and actively involve the Dava Way Association trustees and members in the physical effort and health benefits associated with such activities.
- 2 to promote the Dava Way as a long distance route, for the benefit of the Moray community and its visitors.
- 3 to advance the education of the public regarding the historical influences of the disused railway line.
- 4 to promote active outdoor recreation, in particular walking and cycling, as sustainable and healthy activities to benefit the Moray community and its visitors

Summary of the main activities in relation to these purposes

- Regular major monthly work parties, supplemented by further intervening ad hoc volunteer work.
- Provision and maintenance of interpretation boards at frequent intervals along the route
- Refurbishment of historical artefacts relating to the former railway line.
- Support to a local model railway group with touring displays of the former Dava railway station.
- Organisation of major walking events along the route.
- Contact with other Scottish path groups through nomination by Scottish Natural Heritage as one of Scotland's Great Trails.
- Publicity for all of the above by submissions to local and national press, talks
 and slide shows to local organisations, regular updates to Dava Way website
 and Facebook page, and distribution of the Dava Way Companion guidebook.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

Successful in a bid to Berry Burn Community Fund who provided a grant of £2840 as a contribution towards the purchase of a new tipping trailer. The Association contributed £1106 for this purchase from our own financial resources.

Purchased a second hand ride on mower to improve efficiency of grass cutting operations.

Collaborated with 39 Engineer Regiment based at Kinloss Barracks to deliver a volunteer day to improve drainage and the path surface through the Clashdhu Cutting that involved use of mechanical diggers and 20 army volunteers.

Collaborated with Diageo to deliver a volunteer day for 12 of their employees, cutting back vegetation on Rafford Bank.

Major achievements of our work parties included;

- Path surface improvements north of Lynmore, Huntlys Cave, south of Dava and Clashdhu cutting.
- Drainage improvements on Dava Moor, Aucheorn Cutting and Clasdhu cutting with the later including a new culvert installation.
- General vegetation work at numerous location along the length of the Dava Way
- Refurbishment of notice boards including the provision of new information panels at Edinkillie and Dulicht bridge

Financial review

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

The Trustees are aware of the limitations of our reserve funding, which is nevertheless sufficient for normal day to day operation of the Association. However any significant future plans or projects can only be undertaken as and when reserves allow. The DWA is in a position of having more reserves at our disposal than in previous years. However, trustees intend to use any additional funds either to support collaborative opportunities with other grant funding bodies, in order to deliver significant upgrades to the path or to replace/upgrade important items of equipment should the need arise.

The charity holds reserves to cover both known annual liabilities such as public liability insurance and to have money set aside to cover any unforeseen events or situations. The charity trustees have adopted a figure of £1500 as the minimum level of reserves to be held by the charity, below which all work activities incurring expenditure would be suspended.

Unrestricted funds represent income earned but not yet utilised in supporting the activities of the charity. At 30th April 2020 the charity held £7168 at the bank as unrestricted funds and the trustees consider that this amount is appropriate to allow them to continue to support the charitable purposes and activities of the DWA in the foreseeable future.

Other optional information

- Within the Summary of the Main Activities, volunteers spent 960 hours on work parties to maintain and improve the Dava Way. Other efforts by individuals especially Paul Douglas, not recorded by the DWA to keep vegetation growth in check are also recognised and appreciated by the Trustees.
- Towards the last quarter of 2019 an informal approach was made by the Finderne Development Trust (FDT) to the Dava Way Association (DWA) to explore any mutual areas where future development could take place. FDT is the anchor organisation and key driver of sustainable regeneration of Finderne, the rural area south of Forres. The Dava Way is a corridor through Finderne and therefore several partner projects were identified and a more formal partnership was proposed. A Memorandum of Understanding was developed and 6 main objectives were identified as follows
 - a) Promote the partnership FDT and DWA
 - b) Increase awareness of Dava Way
 - c) Increase footfall on Dava Way
 - d) Increase participation in Dava Way events
 - e) Increase the income stream of the DWA
 - f) Engage more of the local community in the Dava Way project

Due to Covid 19 and the community based work undertaken by FDT, the actions as described above have not progressed further but will hopefully recommence in 2020/21.
